Prague

Prague, the city of a hundred spires, bohemian allure and fairy tale features, more than merits its place in the list of best destinations to visit in the world. In 2019 the city received over 9 million international visitors.

Prague is the capital and the largest city in the Czech Republic with a population of 1.3 million people. Situated on the Vltava river, it is the historical capital of Bohemia and is the political, cultural and economic hub of central Europe.

The city's origins may go back as far as c.1300 BC. In the fourth century BC, Celtic tribes settled in the area. Subsequently, it was occupied by numerous Germanic tribes before being incorporated into the Western Roman Empire, only to be retaken by Germanic tribes. Finally, the 6th century saw the Slavic migration from the east. This ethnic group remains predominant in the modern-day Czech Republic.

Prague was an important city in the Austro-Hungarian Empire, and it played major roles in the Bohemian and Protestant Reformation, the Thirty Years' War, and in 20th-century history as the capital of Czechoslovakia between the World Wars and the post-war Communist era.

The main cultural attractions include Prague Castle, Charles Bridge, Old Town Square with the astronomical clock, the Jewish Quarter, the parks of Petřín hill and Vyšehrad fort. Since 1992, the extensive historic centre of Prague has been included in the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites.

The city boasts more than ten major museums, along with numerous theatres, galleries and an extensive modern public transportation system. It is also home to Charles University, the oldest university in Central Europe.

Tours 1 & 5 Prague Castle

Monday AND Tuesday

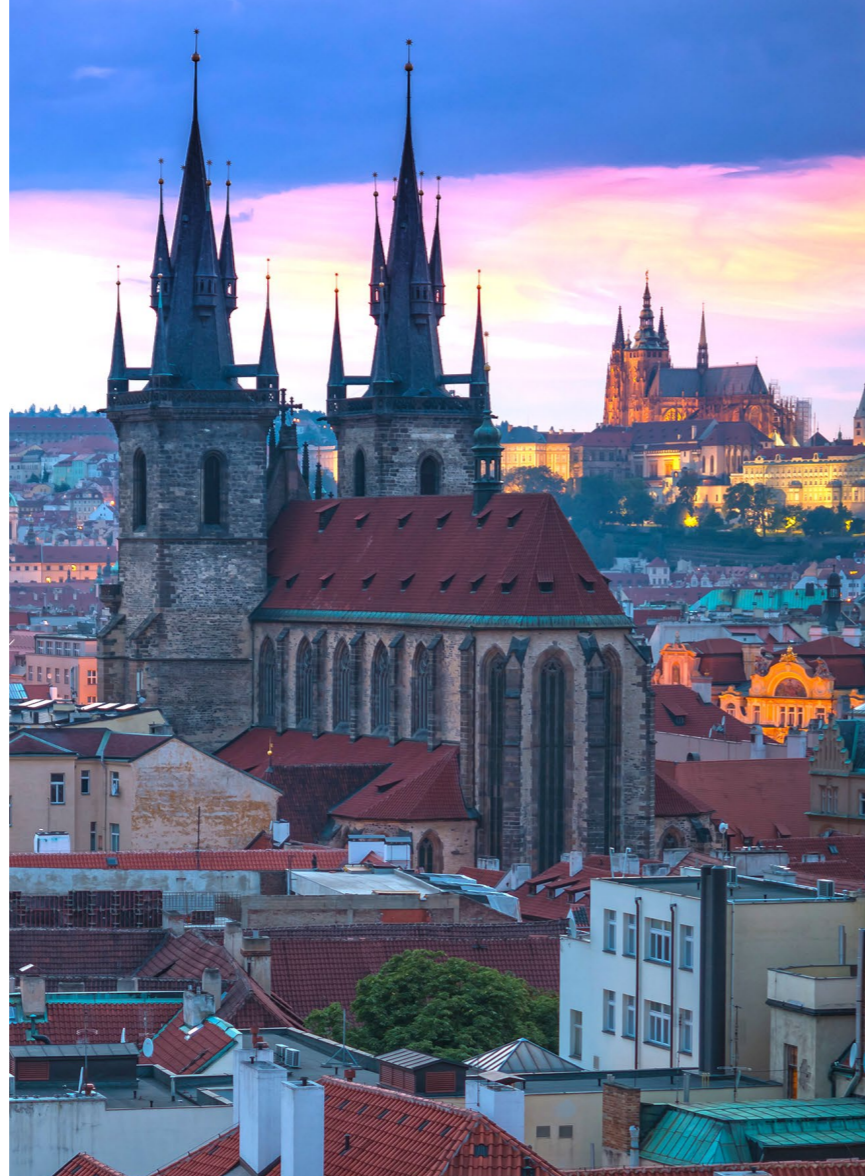
08:30 – 16:00 including lunch

Prague Castle is reputed to be the largest castle complex in the world, occupying an area of 70,000 sqm (17 acres). With its origins in the 9th century, Prague Castle attracts two million visitors every year.

The tour starts with a comfortable funicular ride to the top of Petrin Hill (for those who would like a more spectacular view of the city they can climb the 299 steps up to the top of the tower).

From the top of the hill, a 15-minute walk will take participants to the Prague Castle complex, with its palaces, churches, fortifications, gardens and two Baroque treasures: the ancient library of Strahov Monastery and Loreta. Loreta is a Marian Pilgrimage site with a church, cloisters, chapels and a clock tower holding a 27-bell carillon. The church retains a rare collection of liturgical objects, including the magnificent Prague Sun monstrance.

After lunch, the tour will continue to St. Vitus Cathedral, home to the crown jewels and tombs of former kings and queens; the Old Royal Palace; St. George Basilica and Golden Lane, where Franz Kafka resided.



Tours 2, 7 & 10 Old Town & Vodouch Boat

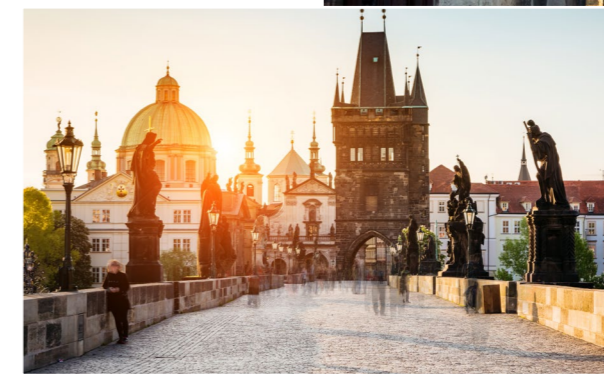
Monday, Tuesday AND Wednesday

09:00 – 12:30

Walking tour. Elevator available for disabled persons at the astronomical clock tower.

The tour begins with a short stroll down the famous Pařížská shopping street to the Old Town Square. The square boasts meticulously preserved buildings of various architectural styles, including the 14th century Gothic Church of Our Lady before Týn, with its two 80-metre high towers, and the lavishly decorated Baroque St. Nicholas Church. The square is dominated by the astronomical clock of the Old Town City Hall. First installed in 1410, it is the third-oldest astronomical clock in the world and the oldest clock still operating. Wonderful views of ‘the city of 100 spires’ can be enjoyed from the top of the clock tower.

The tour continues with a visit to Charles Bridge, the oldest bridge in Prague, followed by a 45-minute cruise aboard a ‘Vodouch,’ a historic wooden boat, through the waterways of old Prague and the ‘Devil’s Canal.’ Participants will enjoy excellent views of Prague Castle and the medieval mills built along the canal.



Tours 3 & 8 Velvet Revolution Tour

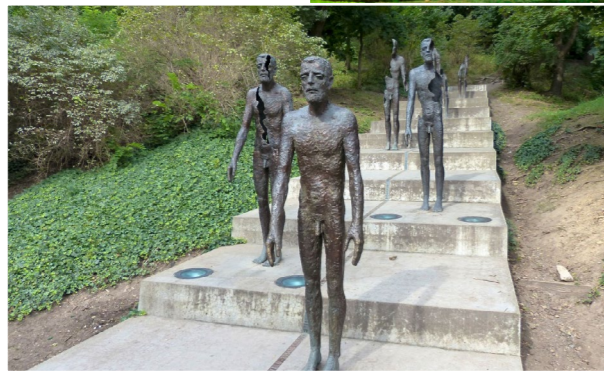
Monday AND Tuesday

13:30 – 16:30

Founded in 1818, the grand neoclassical Czech National Museum on Wenceslas Square, has been closed since 2011 for a major renovation and only re-opened to the public in November 2019.

Participants will visit the exhibition on Czech history, from the foundation of Czechoslovakia to the turn of the millennium, and the Velvet Revolution which is dedicated to the tumultuous events of the 20th century that took place in Wenceslas Square.

The tour will continue to the Jalta Boutique Hotel, where small groups will visit the Jalta Bunker, located in the basement of the hotel. The bunker was built for senior Czech leaders and officers of the Warsaw Pact. Until 1989, it was the headquarters of the STB secret police, notorious for 'bugging' western guests of the hotel from ten metres (32 ft) below ground.



Tours 4 & 12 Franz Kafka & the Jewish Quarter

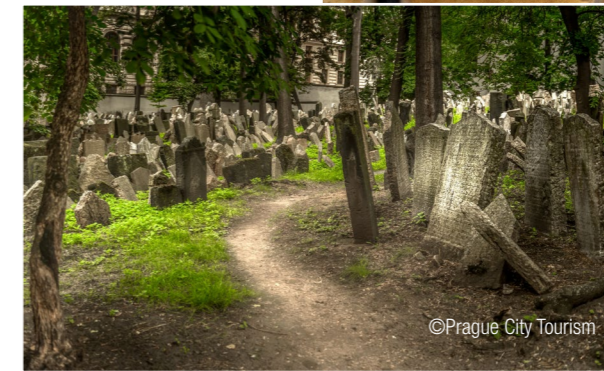
Monday AND Wednesday

13:30 – 16:30

Prague's Jewish Quarter was founded in the 10th century. Most of the original quarter was demolished between 1893 and 1913 as part of an initiative to model the city on Paris. Today, only six synagogues remain, as well as the Old Jewish Cemetery, the Old Jewish Town Hall and the Ceremonial Hall, which are now all part of the Prague Jewish Museum.

The tour includes visits to the Pinkas Synagogue and cemetery as well as the Old-New Synagogue, Europe's oldest active synagogue and home to the infamous Golem, a legend created by a rabbi to protect Prague's 16th century ghetto from persecution.

Next stop, the Franz Kafka Museum dedicated to one of the ghetto's most famous sons and author of many works including 'The Castle,' 'The Trial' and 'Metamorphosis.' The museum hosts a permanent exhibition entitled 'The City of K. Franz Kafka and Prague,' which chronicles the author's life and works and includes several first edition Kafka books as well as originals of his letters, diaries and drawings.

Tour 6 U Fleku Brewery & Historical Tramway

Tuesday

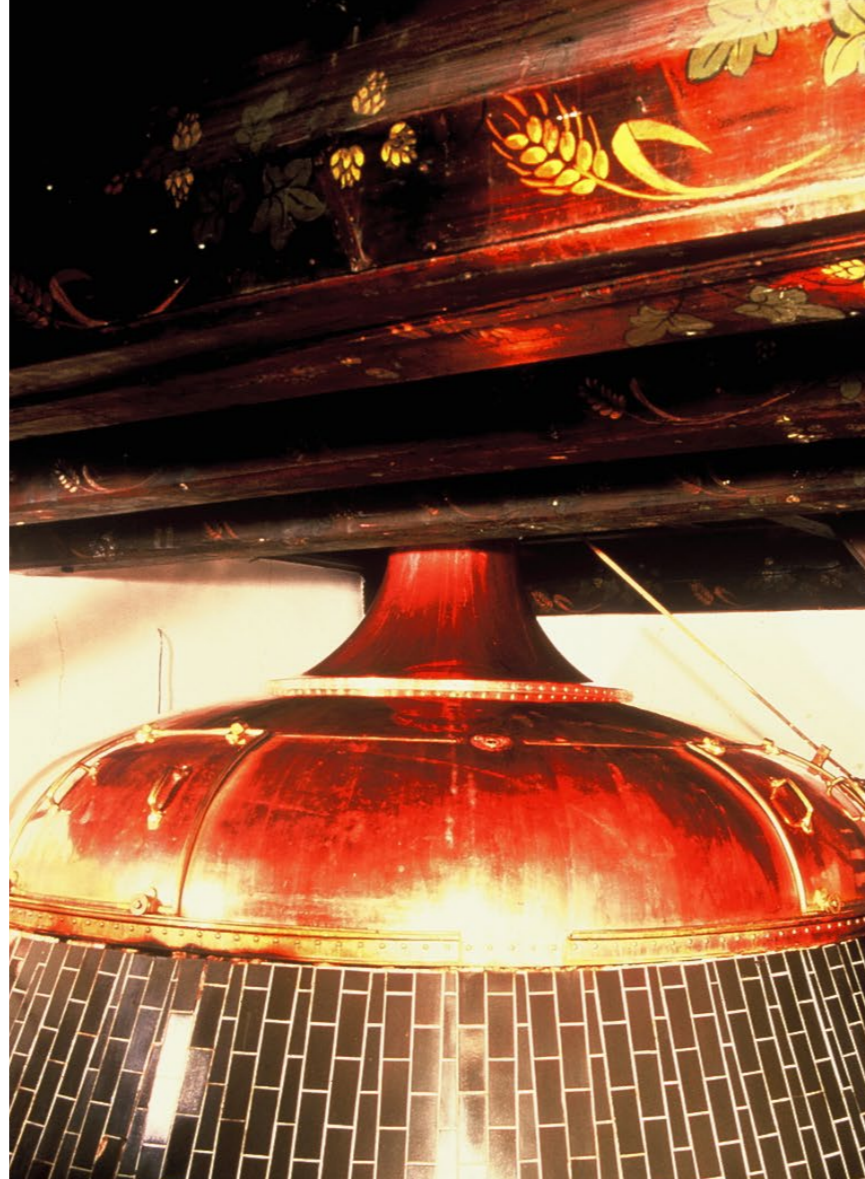
08:30 – 13:30 including lunch

It is very important to be on time for the tram departure!

The itinerary starts from the old tram station, located close to the hotel. The oldest coaches date back to the beginning of the 20th century, some of which will be used for the tour. The tram will take participants on a 40-minute journey through the city centre.

The tour continues with a visit to Prague's historic U Fleku brewery where participants will have lunch. U Fleku is one of the few breweries in central Europe that has been brewing continuously for over 500 years.

It was nationalised with the onset of communist rule and the original owners, the Brtník family, regained the brewery and restaurant in 1991, after the fall of the regime. It is now a place of pilgrimage for beer aficionados from around the world. Only two thousand glasses of its dark lager are produced every day and it can only be acquired on the brewery's premises.



Tour 9 Nizbor Crystal & Karlstejn Castle

Wednesday

08:30 – 16:00 including lunch

Travel time to Karlstejn is approximately 1 hour depending on traffic.

Please note that there is a 20-25 minutes uphill walk to the castle.

Owned by the Rückl family, the Nizbor glassworks has been renowned for its top-quality Bohemian cut crystal since 1846. Each stage of production will be explained and demonstrated, including the art of glassblowing and the craftsmanship of glass cutting and painting.

One of the Czech Republic's most visited sites, the majestic Karlstejn Castle, was built in 1348 on the orders of Czech King and Holy Roman Emperor, Charles IV, as a stronghold for the crown jewels and royal treasures. The castle underwent several reconstructions: in the late Gothic style after 1480, in the Renaissance style in the late 16th century, and the neo-Gothic style in the late 19th century, giving the castle its current appearance.

Displayed in the Chapel of the Holy Cross are 129 board paintings which represent the magnum opus of Master Theodorik, a highly influential Bohemian Gothic painter to the court of Charles IV. The castle also houses replicas of the crown jewels.



Tour 11 A Morning at the State Opera

Wednesday

09:30 – 12:30

Discover one of the city's most exquisite buildings, the grand Prague State Opera. Its stage parameters and auditorium capacity make it the most spectacular theatre house in Prague. Originally built as the German Theater, the ornate Neo-Rococo structure was designed by Viennese architects Fellner & Hellmer in 1888. Despite falling into disrepair during the post-communist years, the Prague State Opera has now been fully restored to its previous glory and the opulent interiors are truly magnificent, blending elegant white and gold décor with plush red velvet and glittering chandeliers. The State Opera is tightly linked with some of the greatest names in music history, such as composers Gustav Mahler, Richard Strauss, and Alois Hába, Italian tenor Enrico Caruso and others.

The tour continues with a visit to the Blanka Matragi exhibition in the Gaming Parlours of the Municipal House. The world-famous Czech haute couture fashion designer is inspired mainly by her extensive travels, as well as by music and graphics. The exhibition presents spectacular dresses and accessories but also glass, porcelain, sculptures, chandeliers and graphic art. Her current clientele comes from royal palaces in the Persian Gulf.



Maats/Liebherr Golf Tournament

Prague City Golf Club

Wednesday 21 September

07:30 – 15:30 (exact times to be confirmed)

The Prague City Golf Club is located in Zbraslav, in the south-west district of Prague, approximately 20 minutes travel time from the city centre. Opened in 2009, the 6,560-metre (7,170-yard), par 72 championship course was the first 18-hole golf course built in the city. It was designed by British architect Jeremy Ford in cooperation with the resident U.S. PGA Tour player, Alex Cejka.

The front 'Links Nine' and the back 'Lakes Nine' present a dual personality of challenging playing conditions, accented with red sand waste bunkers providing remarkable visual contrasts along the course. The clubhouse and restaurant are housed in very tastefully renovated 200-year-old stables and all the terraces offer a beautiful view over the golf course.

The 'Himalayas,' a unique 18-hole putting course inspired by the 'Ladies Putting Course' at St. Andrews' in Scotland, and a 9,000 sq m (2.2 acre) driving range with 18 covered positions (one of the largest in the Czech Republic), are two additional amenities that make this course so special. A second driving range (warm up area) allows golfers to practice prior to teeing up for the first hole.

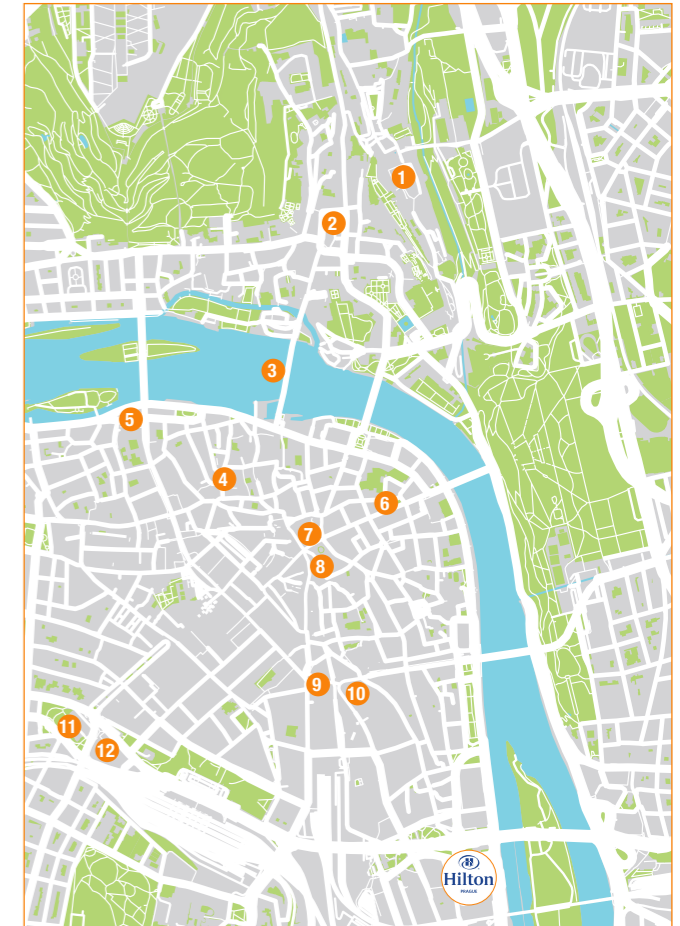

Check-in/Check-out Times

Hotel check-in time is 15:00. Every effort will be made by the Hilton Prague to accommodate guests arriving before the check-in time however, rooms may not be immediately available.

Hotel check-out time is 10:00. Requests to retain rooms beyond this time should be directed to the front desk upon your arrival. Should it be possible to retain the room beyond the check-out time, a late departure charge may be applicable.

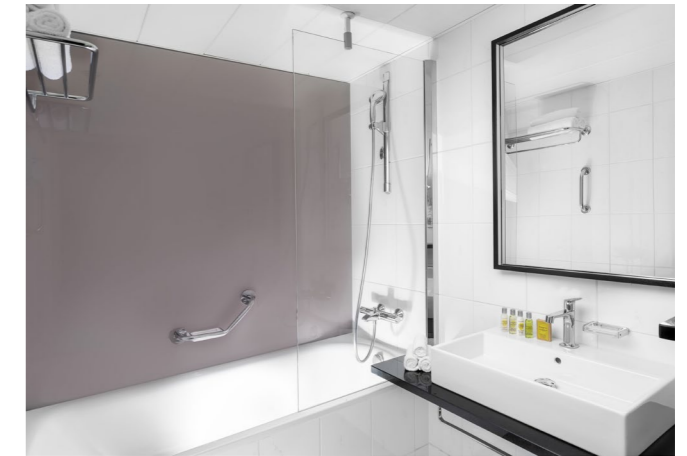

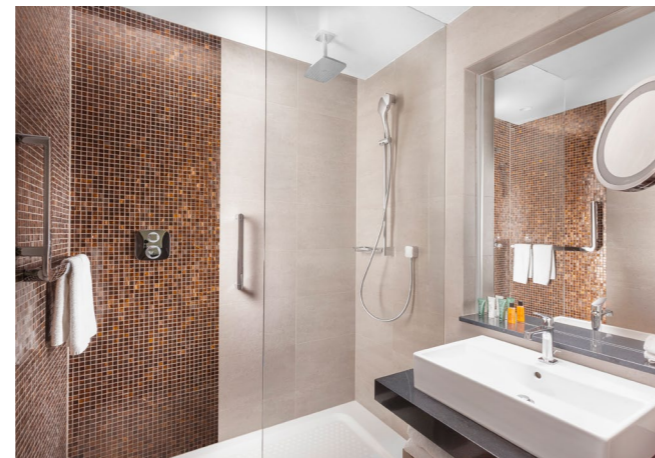

Travel Requirements

All passports and ID cards must be valid for six months after your travel dates to the Czech Republic.

Inhabitants of the European Union require a passport or other form of valid identification in order to enter the Czech Republic. The same applies for the citizens of Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway and Switzerland.

In 2007 the Czech Republic signed the Schengen agreement which allows the inhabitants of Schengen countries to move freely within the Schengen area without having to go through border checkpoints. Visitors must, however, have their passport or identification card with them when travelling.

UK citizens do not need a visa, however, the Prague Convention Bureau recommends all UK citizens travel with their passport because an ID card might not be sufficient.

To check **the latest visa requirements** and the list of countries whose citizens do require a visa, visit the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic at: http://www.mzv.cz/jnp/en/information_for_alien/short_stay_visa/list_of_states_whose_citizens_are/index.html

- ▶ Participants from countries requiring a visa are strongly advised to make their applications in their home country at least six weeks before their planned travel date.
- ▶ If you require an **invitation letter from IPLOCA** to accompany your visa application, please tick the appropriate box when registering for the convention and the IPLOCA Secretariat will send you one.

IPLOCA Arrival Transfers

From Vaclav Havel International Airport to the Hilton Prague hotel

Dates: **Saturday 17 September** and
Sunday 18 September

Open to all IPLOCA attendees, **pre-registration required.**

- ▶ The airport is 13 km from the hotel and the journey will take from 30 minutes to an hour depending on traffic.
- ▶ Look for the IPLOCA signage after you exit the baggage-claim area.

From the Hilton Prague hotel to Vaclav Havel International Airport

- ▶ We suggest you plan on leaving the hotel a minimum of three hours before your flight departure time.

Detailed flight information must be provided for all arrival and departure transfer requests.

Transfers will only be provided for those persons who have received a confirmation email from the Secretariat.

If you are not arriving in Prague on Saturday or Sunday, 17-18 September, below is some information on how to get to the hotel.

Taxi

Taxis are located just outside the Terminal 1 and Terminal 2 arrival halls.

Airport taxis, [Fix Taxi](#) and [Fin Taxi Prague](#) provide a reliable service to and from the airport. They operate non-stop, and guarantee prices based on the number of kilometres.

The taxi fare from the airport to the hotel is about CZK 700 (approximately EUR 28). Payment can be made in cash (Czech Korunas or Euros) or by credit card. VISA and MASTERCARD are accepted, but not American Express.

Hotel Transfer Service

The Hilton Prague provides a transfer service to and from the airport. A standard one-way arrival or departure transfer to/from Vaclav Havel Airport is CZK 900 (approximately EUR 40). Maximum occupancy is three persons per vehicle.

To reserve a private transfer, send an email to the hotel's Transportation Manager jan.kucera@hilton.com or call +420 702 167 359.

A minimum of 24 hours' notice is required and the cost can be charged to a credit card, or to your room. Cancellations must be made at least 24 hours before the date of the transfer.

Convention App

General Information

Time

Prague is 2 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT +2 hours) in the Summer, from 27 March to 29 October 2022.

Banks

Banks are open from Monday to Friday from 09:00 to 18:00. Automatic cash machines (ATMs) are widely available.

Currency

The official currency of the Czech Republic is the Czech crown (koruna), abbreviated as Kč, with the international abbreviation CZK. The smallest denomination is 1 crown, which consists of 100 hellers (haléř), abbreviated as hal.

As the official currency, the Czech crown is the best and often the only currency to use when paying. Even though the Czech Republic is part of the European Union, the euro is not widely accepted. Some stores, restaurants and hotels accept payments in euros but the exchange rate may not be very favourable.

Electricity

The electricity in the Czech Republic is 230V. Outlets have the standard European socket with two small round holes and a protruding earth (ground) pin. If you have a different plug, bring an adapter. North American 110V appliances will also need a transformer if they don't have a built-in voltage adjustment.

Water

Tap water is safe to drink in Prague and in other large cities in the Czech Republic.

Smoking

Smoking is banned in all enclosed and covered public places including the airport, work places, health centres, schools, public transport, hotels, restaurants, bars and nightclubs.

Security

Along with the increase in tourism, Prague has its fair share of tourist scams and pickpockets. Be extra aware of this when you are in a large crowd and at popular places like the astronomical clock, as pickpockets like to target crowds where distracted tourists gather. Keep an eye on your wallet, phone and any other valuables. **In any emergency call 112 for the Police, Fire or Medical Rescue Service.**

Climate & Clothing

The best time to visit Prague is between mid-September to mid-October when the temperatures range from 8°C to 19°C (47°F to 65°F) with an average of 6 hours of sunshine each day.

Think layers when packing. In the morning you will need a light jacket or warm sweater and by the afternoon you will probably take it off. Pack jeans or trousers, long-sleeved tops, and lightweight sweaters for casual wear.

Shopping

Shops are open from 09:00 to 19:00 Monday to Friday, and 10:00 to 18:00 on Saturday.

Shopping centres are open from 09:00 to 21:00 every day.

Prague has many shopping centres where you will find the usual global brands, but the city is particularly known for its abundance of boutiques and designer shops.

Within a ten-minute walk from the Hilton Prague is the Palladium Praha shopping centre on Nam Republiky 1. Housed in converted barracks from the 1800s, there are five floors with 177 shops and a large choice of cafés and restaurants. For more information go to: www.palladiumpraha.cz/en/.





Eating out

In the last 15 years the number, quality and variety of Prague's restaurants has expanded beyond all recognition and visitors can now enjoy a wide range of international cuisine throughout the city.

That said, don't let the kaleidoscope of cuisines blind you to the pleasures of good old-fashioned, no-nonsense Czech food. Some of the local specialties you should definitely try are potato soup, goulash, Svičková (braised beef) with dumplings, Palačinky (Czech pancakes), and Trdelník (chimney cake).

Today, Prague has a lively, ever-changing restaurant scene, and a growing band of food bloggers and food tour guides. As the Czechs say, 'dobrou chuť' (bon appétit!).

Getting around

Never hail a taxi from a tourist area. The taxi ranks in the most popular tourist areas such as Wenceslas Square, Lesser Town and Charles Bridge tend to be extremely expensive.

Make sure that you are getting into an authorised taxi that has an identification number, the company name and the fares marked clearly on the doors, and black and white checked stripes along the side. If these are missing, the driver is infringing the regulations and it is recommended that you use another taxi.

It is always better to negotiate the price before getting into a taxi.

Tipping

In general, tourists are expected to tip around 10% in restaurants. More for great service, and less for mediocre service. If you are paying by credit card, ask the waitperson to add the tip before they pass your credit card. If paying in cash, give the tip directly to the waitperson, don't leave it on the table.

Don't feel obliged to tip a bellman in a hotel, a guide or a chauffeur.

Do's and Don'ts

Do avoid the taxi drivers waiting at taxi ranks in tourist locations. Make sure you are getting into an authorised taxi and the driver turns on the meter. It is safer to agree on the fee before you get in the taxi.

Don't call Prague Eastern Europe. Prague is in Central Europe, not Eastern Europe. They will let you know if you call it Eastern Europe, because it is not.

Don't assume everyone speaks English. While most of the young population do speak English, they appreciate it if you ask first.

Do attempt to learn a few Czech Phrases. Locals appreciate when foreigners begin the conversation in Czech before continuing in English. A simple 'dobrý den' or 'dobrý večer' (good day or good evening) goes a long way.

Don't expect a lot of personal space. Czechs have a different sense of physical space. Don't be surprised if you feel crowded on the tram or if someone tries to get by you without saying excuse me.

Don't be deterred by all the tourists. Prague is seeing more tourists every year, but don't let that scare you off. They are coming for a reason, and that's because Prague is such a great destination. The tourists tend to stick to a few main areas and streets, so it's still really easy to escape the crowds and find the more authentic side of Prague.

Don't expect an inexpensive destination. Prague is more affordable than many other European cities, but it's not an inexpensive destination. It's possible to get good deals in Prague, but it's not the least expensive city in Europe.

Don't expect the same level of service. Service is very hit or miss in Prague but it is improving. You will not find the overly friendly service you would see in the US, or the super-efficient service you would expect in Germany. That said, Prague has some really nice restaurants, and as tipping becomes more widespread, the service is improving.
